We expect to receive funding of approximately £22,800 during the academic year. We plan to spend it as detailed below:

Swimming: Providing additional opportunities for swimming above the basic requirement. Many of the children have never attended organised swimming lessons prior to these. Impact of the PE and Sports Premium in 2023/24

Provision	Impact
Swimming in Year 3 & 4	Children attended weeks of intensive swimming lessons which were well attended. In Year 3 & 4 the following swim distances were achieved; 0m - 15 children , 5m - 81 children, 10m - 43 children, 25m - 23 children, 50m - 31 children & 400m - 3 children.
Specialist Basketball Coach	Staff confidence in teaching basketball increased as a result of opportunities to observe specialist teaching and teach alongside the coach. After school club was very popular (60 children were able to participate over the year). Feedback from the children is very positive.
Park Federation Sporting Calendar	Over 100 children had the opportunity to represent CPA in a range of different sports including; basketball, football, netball, cricket, tennis, boccia, athletics and dodgeball.
Specialist Cricket Coach	Curriculum lessons and afterschool clubs took place and were well attended (120 & 20 children respectively). Children enjoyed taking part in sessions and it resulted in many of them wanting to play with friends who didn't attend the club at break and lunch times.
Real P.E membership	Real P.E platform has been valuable in giving children clear and progressive lessons during indoor P.E. Teachers have enjoyed using the online lesson aids to assist during teaching gymnastics and dance. The online resources, such as videos, means that teachers that are less confident in demonstrating can show children the safe, expected way that a move/balance/skill is to be performed.
Netball Club	Netball club was fairly well attended (6-12 girls) and has enabled us to represent the school at the Federation Netball event.
Football Club	Approximately 25 children, both boys and girls, attended training, Borough fixtures and Federation football competitions.
Transport	Without Hillingdon Community Transport membership we couldn't enter all the inter school and federation sports events that we do. It is the only viable way of getting children to events.

1st Aid/Staff support

Enabled us to compete in Federation and Borough sports events outside of school.
