- Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.

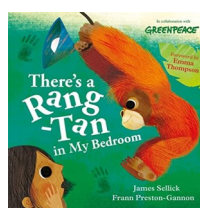
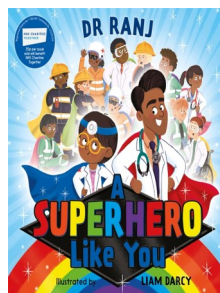
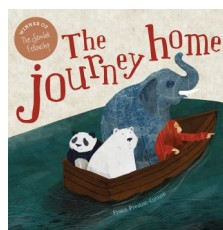
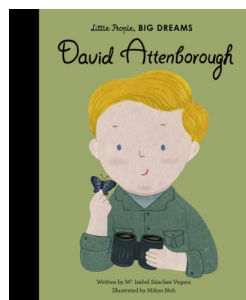
Communication and Language

Physical Development

During our PE sessions we will be developing our gross motor skills by working in teams and playing games together.

The objectives we are working towards are:

- Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing.
- Negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others.

Home Learning

Home learning will be sent home every **Monday** and is also uploaded to Google Classroom. We really encourage the use of Google classroom as there are many useful resources that can be accessed to support learning at home. Reading at home is a vital part of home learning and we encourage that this is carried out daily.

Maths

This term in maths we will be exploring new mathematical concepts, such as doubling, grouping and odd and even numbers.

The objectives we are working towards are:

- Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system.
- Automatically recall (without reference to rhymes, counting or other aids) number bonds up to 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to 10, including double facts.
- Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one quantity is greater than, less than or the same as the other quantity.

Understanding of the World

In this half of the term we will be thinking about some real life superheroes. These are people who make a difference to the world that we live in and the people who help us to stay safe.

For example, David Attenborough and Greta Thunberg educate us in helping to protect our planet. Where as nurses, doctors, fire-fighters and many more help us when we need it the most.

The objectives we are working towards are:

- Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.
- Describe their immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.
- Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society.
