Top up swimming lessons Swimming in Year 3 & 4	Children attended weeks of intensive swimming lessons which were well attended. In Year 3 & 4 the following swim distances were achieved; 0m - 28 children , 5m - 45 children, 10m - 78 children, 25m - 49 children The children all gained confidence in the water and enjoyed their swimming lessons.
Swimming in Year 5 & 6	Children attended weeks of intensive swimming lessons which were well attended. In Year 3 & 4 the following swim distances were achieved; 0m - 32 children , 5m - 45 children, 10m - 53 children, 25m - 72 children The children all gained confidence in the water and enjoyed their swimming lessons. More children accessing swimming outside of school. Provision of the pop up pool significantly increased swimming competence in 2024-25 with 45% achieving the expected standard compared with just 20% previously.
External sports coaches	Children accessing high quality specialist led lessons. Increased teacher confidence and competence.

External Cricket Coach	Curriculum lessons and afterschool clubs took place and were well attended (120 & 20 children respectively). Children enjoyed taking part in sessions and it resulted in many of them wanting to play with friends who didn't attend the club at break and lunch times.
Educational Platforms and resources Primary P.E Planning membership	Primary PE Planning platform has been valuable in giving children clear and progressive lessons during indoor and outdoor P.E lessons. Teachers have enjoyed using the online lesson aids to assist during teaching gymnastics and dance. The online resources, such as videos, means that teachers that are less confident in demonstrating can show children the safe, expected way that a move/balance/skill is to be performed.
External CPD Primary P.E Planning CPD	CPD to introduce staff to the Primary PE Planning online platform and how the resources provided can be used to deliver high quality P.E lessons.
SEN P.E training	Improved provision for children with SEN. P.E coaches have visited local SEN schools to develop their understanding and skill set in order to deliver tailored high quality SEN lessons to SEN groups within the school. This is alongside class teachers/LSA which helps build their knowledge also.
Internal learning and development	CPD based on Primary PE Planning delivered in Spring term to ensure staff are comfortable with the PPP platform and to aid any issues they may be having. Practical lesson CPD delivered.
Extra Curricular Opportunities	Netball club was well attended (12-18 girls) and has enabled us to represent the school at the Federation Netball event. Autumn term - 155, Spring term - 173, Summer term - 169.
Active transport	Hillingdon Community Transport membership enables us to enter the vast range of inter school and Federation sports events that we participate in.
Internal Equipment and Resources	A range of SEN specific equipment was purchased including rock'n'rolla shells, play tunnels, pom-poms and space hoppers which all help with the delivery of engaging, stimulating and safe SEN P.E lessons which promote independence and development of gross and fine motor skills.
