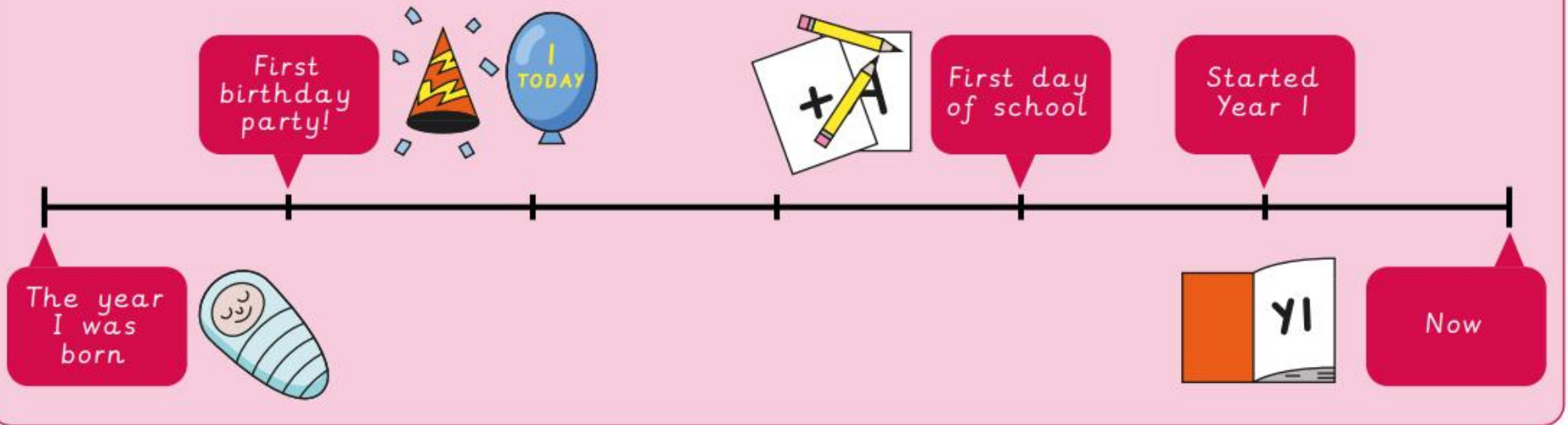

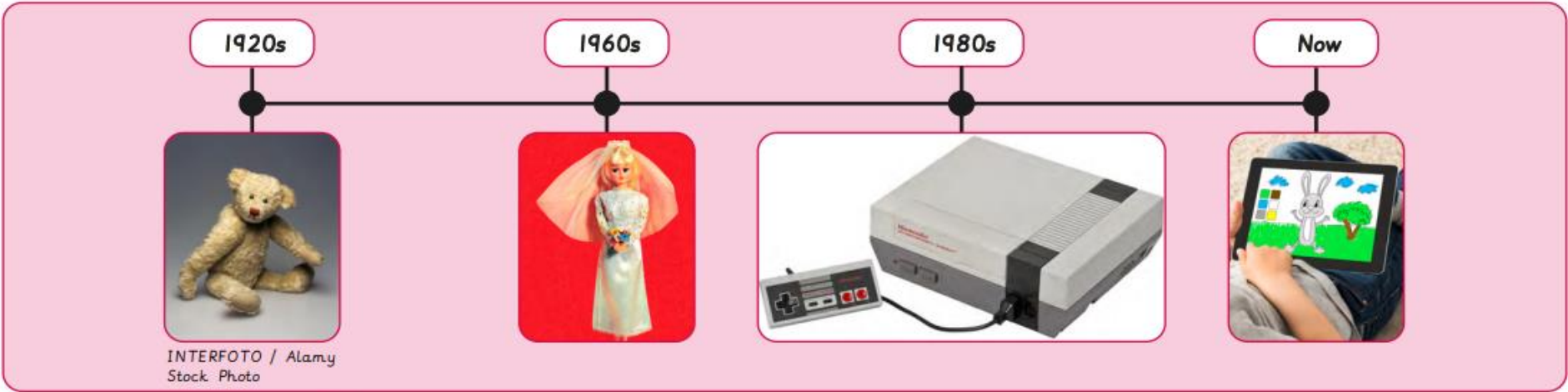

Made from wood or metal.

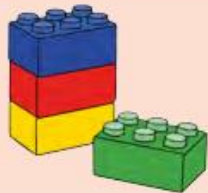


Moved by hand.

Made from plastic.



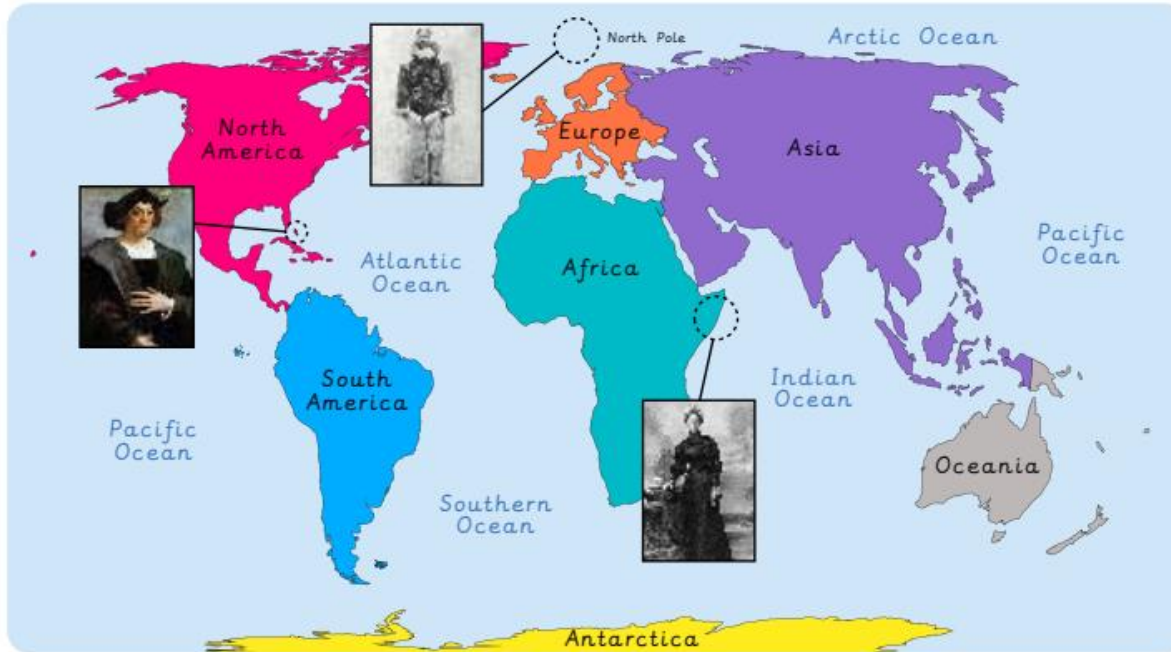
Use batteries to move, light up or make noises.

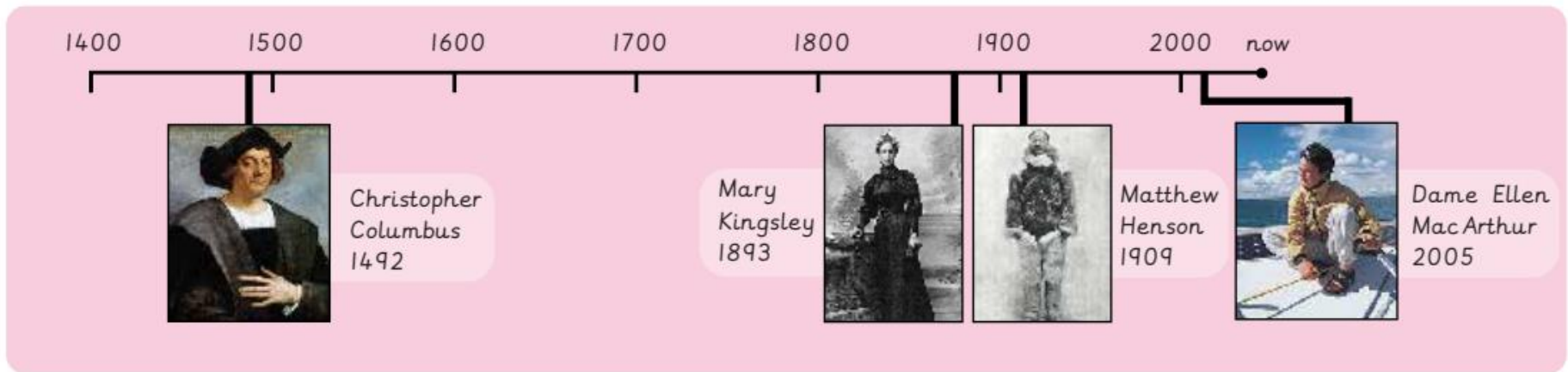

THE VICTORIANS

Some facts about life for children in Victorian times:

- For a long time, girls weren't allowed to go to school.
- When they were finally allowed, they had separate lessons to boys.
- Teachers could hit any children who were being naughty with a cane!
- Poor children didn't really get to go to school. Instead, they had to work.
- Girls would become maids or nannies to rich families' babies.
- Boys could become chimney sweeps, miners or work in factories.
- If families were really poor, they would live in a workhouse.
- They had disgusting food called gruel and were often dirty.
- Rich families would have expensive, fancy toys.
- Poor families had to make toys out of whatever they could find around the house.

Victorian schools	Modern Schools
60 - 80 children in a classroom.	Up to 30 children in a classroom.
